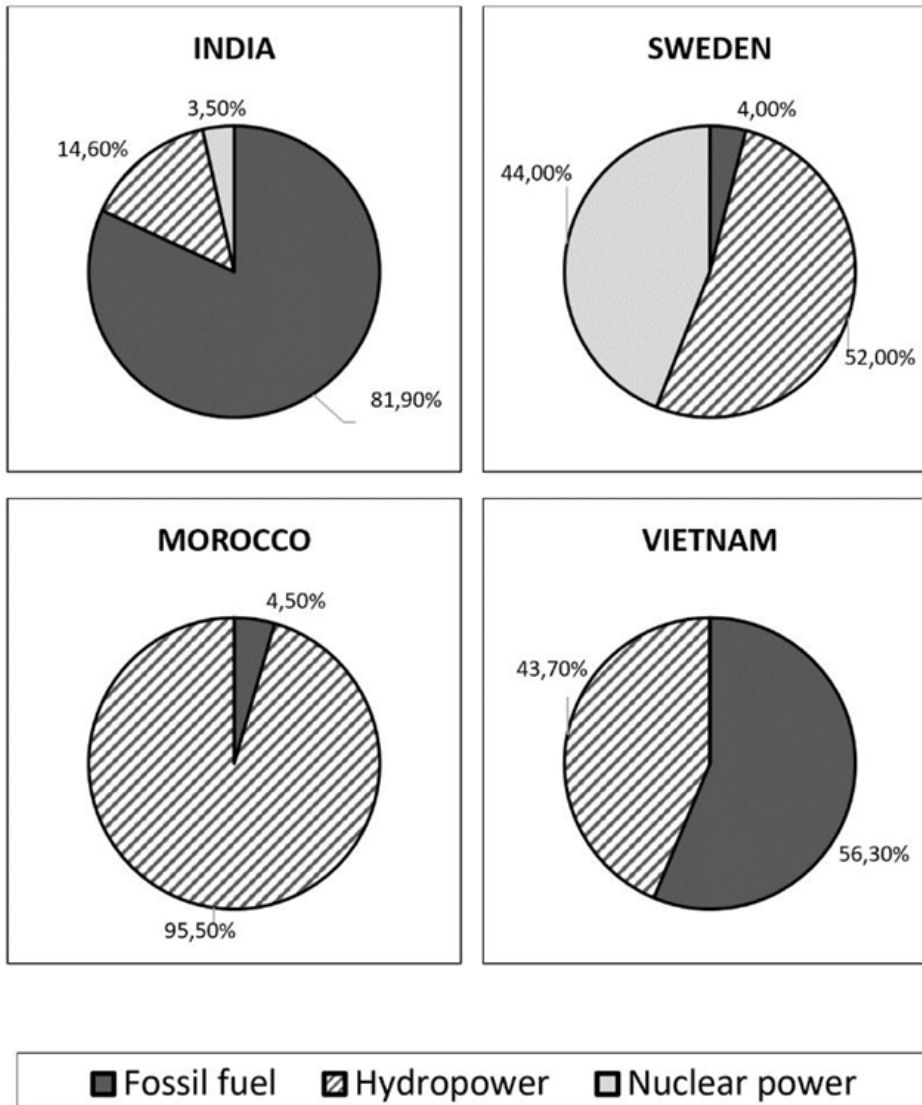

Task One

Topic

The pie charts below show the sources of the electricity produced in four countries in four countries between 2003 and 2008. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features, and make comparison where relevant.



Your's Answer

The provided pie charts give information about the percentage of produced electricity from three different sources (fossil fuel, hydropower and nuclear power) in four countries namely India, Sweden, Morocco and Vietnam between 2003 and 2008.

Overall, the fossil fuels were the dominant source of electricity in India and Vietnam, while Sweden relied mostly on renewable energy and nuclear power. Morocco, on the other had generated its electricity from almost only Hydropower.

In India, Fossil fuels accounted for the overwhelming majority of electricity production, at just under 82%. Hydropower contributed 14.6%, whereas nuclear power represented a relatively small share, at 3.5%. Similarly, Vietnam was highly dependant on fossil suels, which made up 56.3% of its total energy supply, with the remaining 43.70% was from Hydropower. Unlike India, Vietnam did not use nuclear power at all.

In contrast, Sweden's electricity generation came mainly from hydropower (52%)

and nuclear energy (44%) while fossil fuels contributed only 4%. Morocco's pattern was totally different than others, as almost all came from hydropower taking up 95.5%, whereas fossil fuels had only 4.5%
